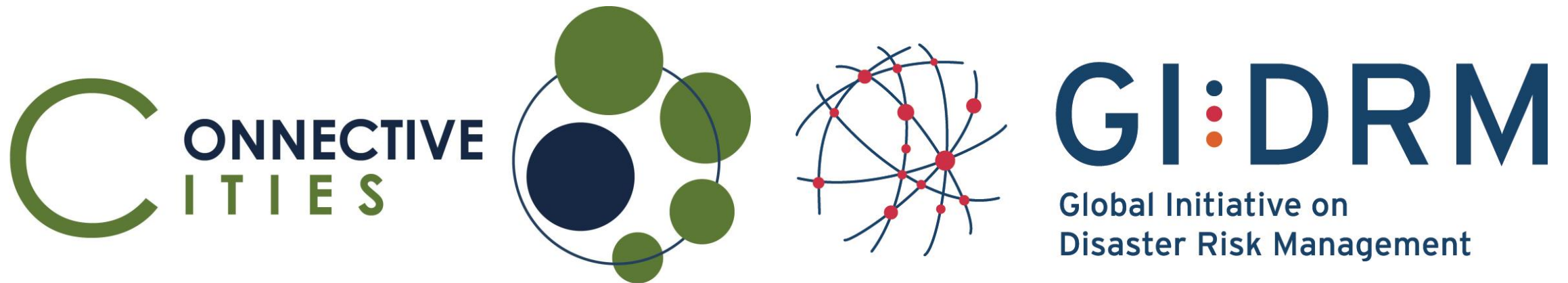

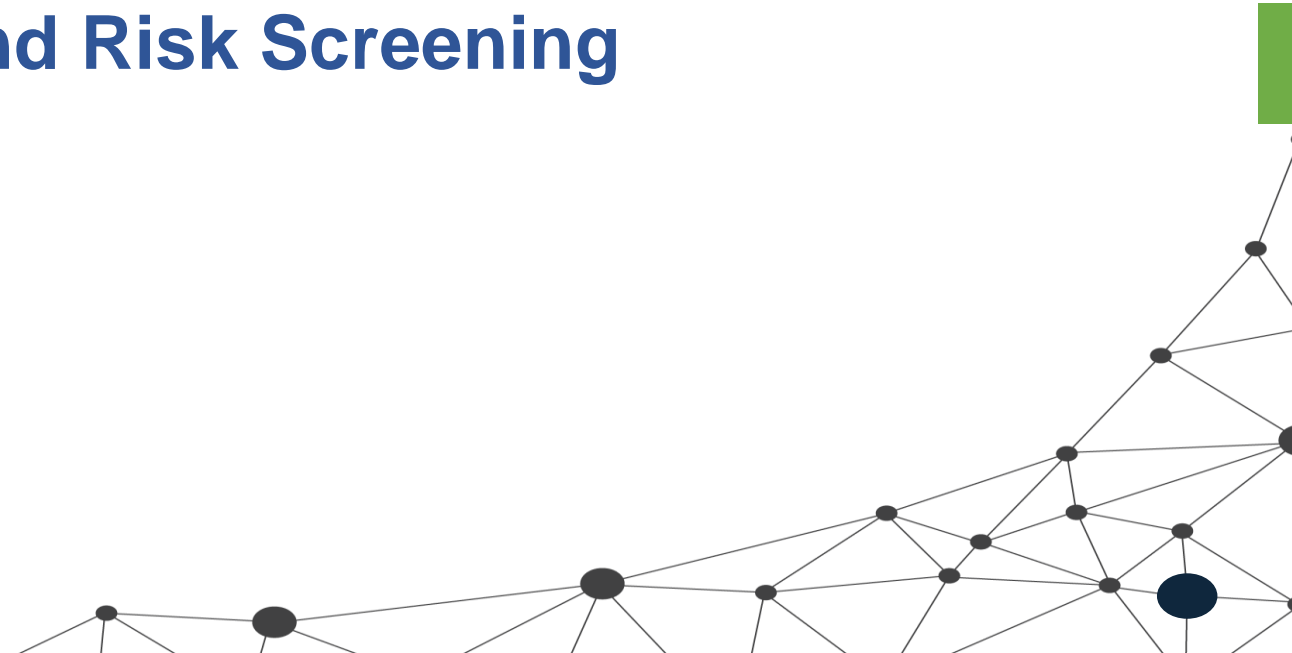

Home-fun exercise for Risk Appraisal, Risk Assessment and Risk Screening



Guiding questions

- Identification of all threats - Frequency (how often will this threat occur), Magnitude (how big is this threat), Impact (How large are its effects).
 - *who and what (sectors such as water, agriculture, and energy) will be influenced by a potential hazard?*
- Identification of exposures and vulnerabilities – Who will be affected and how will they be affected?
 - *Understanding what the interconnected vulnerabilities and the multiple threats are?*
- Estimating complex risks, opportunities, and uncertainties.
 - *Are there any trade-offs and uncertainties involved in taking courses of action?*
- Among the multiple tools and methods, ranging from qualitative techniques to quantitative models for complex risk appraisal. With which have you worked with and or which elements have been already used in your jurisdiction.
 - *For the selection of such method, which development objectives, capacities, resources, and data where considered/used?*
- Develop initial monitoring and evaluation (M&E system).
