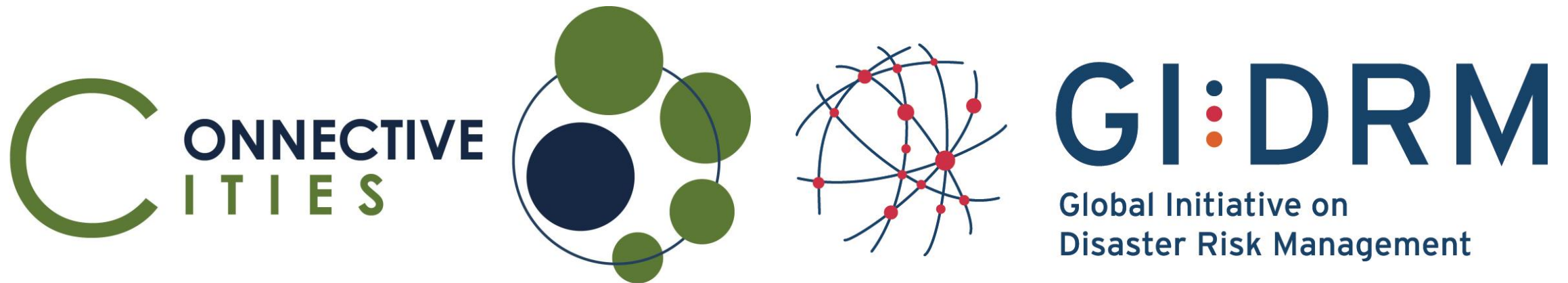

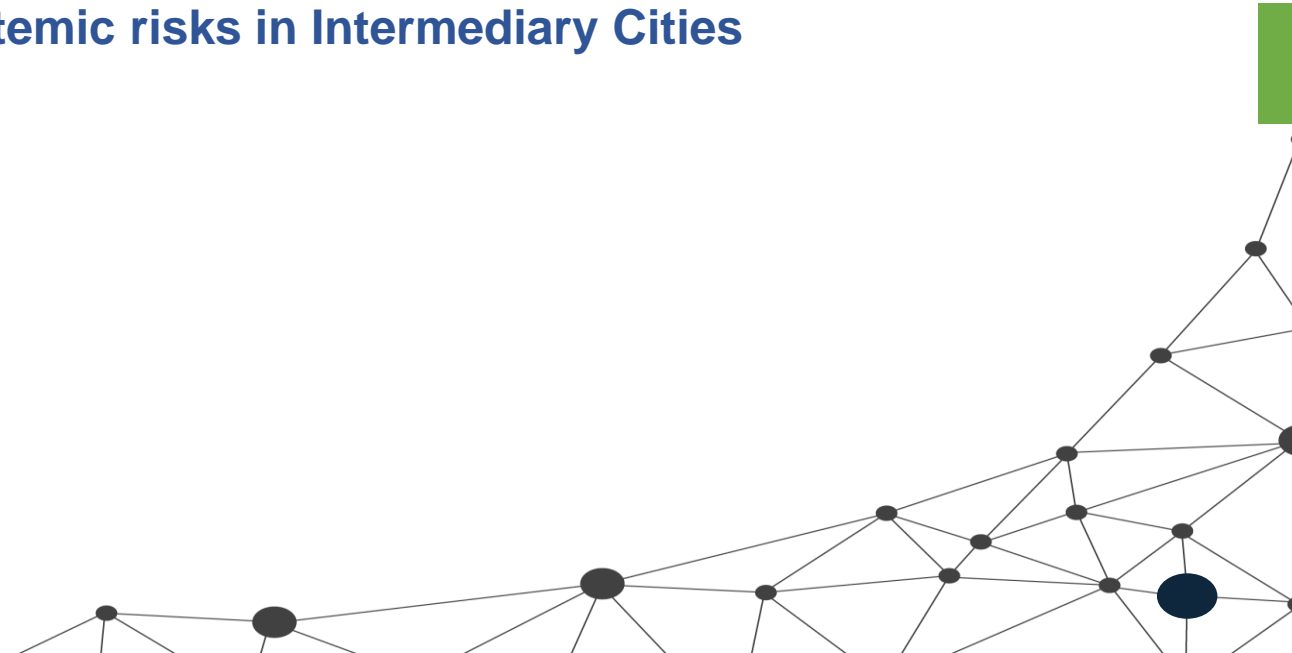

Guiding questions for Options Appraisal



Guiding questions

- Are the risks to implementation clearly understood, and do the options address those risks?
- What are the costs and benefits – monetary, social, cultural, and environmental impact, etc. – of the proposed development choice(s)?
 - What was the primary reason for the option chosen?
- Have the necessary resources and legal frameworks been put in place to enable implementation?
- How does the development option need to be adjusted to avoid and reduce risk creation, and to capture potential benefits?



Insight moment - Pursuing risk informed urban development that leaves no one behind

- Mr. Arghya Sinha Roy – Asian Development Bank
- Cities in Asia and the Pacific need to plan for a warmer world. This would require moving beyond business-as-usual urban development, to ensure understanding of climate and disaster risk is at the heart of every single decision that a city makes. Risk-informed planning, investment and financing would need to play a critical role in enabling this shift and ensuring the benefits of resilience are effective and leaves no one behind.
