Definitions:

- **Disaster**: A serious disruption of the functioning of a community or society posing a significant, wide spread threat to human life, health, property or the environment. Situation exceed the ability of the affected community or society to cope using its own resources. A disaster is declared by the President (Namibia). (sudden accident or natural catastrophe that cause great damage or loss of life).
- Emergency: An unexpected situation that endangers life properties & environment . Occur more regular than a disaster, requires the availability of emergency services (fire, medical, police to ensure the proper response. (Declared by the President, Namibia).
- **DRM:** Continuous and integrated multi-sectoral and multi-disciplinary process of planning and implementation of measures aimed at (drm phases).

Background: Disasters and Emergencies

- Historical events; regarded as "Acts of God", Noah's ark, Egypt locusts, evil star, bad luck or the inability of human to please the gods etc.
- Caused by natural or man-made hazards nothing to do with curses (Epidemics, Volcanos, earthquakes, war, flood, drought etc.
- Theories on DRM: ensure that people's lives, properties & environ... are protected.
- Less humans can do to prevent it
- Ensure that there are structures in place to manage (prevention, mitigation, preparedness, response, recovery & rehabilitation (REDUCTION).

LADRMC (WHAT&WHY, CHALLENGES)

- Local Authority Disaster Risk Management Committee, oversee all matters concerns the prevention, mitigation, preparedness, response, rehabilitation and recovery from the impact of incidents, hazards, emergencies/disasters, jurisdiction area.
- Challenges:
- Many LAs do not have the Local Authority Disaster Risk Management Committee .
- Members are not active or members are not clear on their roles and responsibilities.
- Membership structure not clear/known.

- Some LAs have LADRMC members coming from their own institutions; for example, a committee chaired by CEOs and comprise only internal stakeholders.
- Not aware of Disaster Risk Management Act No 10, of 2012.

Fire Fighters & Capacity (FF)

- Mostly responding to cases such as drowning, flooding, car accidents, vehicle rescue and extrication, hazardous incidents and any other emergencies.
- Fire Fighters also partake in DRM/emergency public awareness.
- Some LAs do have Fire Fighters/ Permanent FF and in many cases use personnel from other departments.



FF continues

- Some LAs do not have qualified Fire Fighters.
- Grade 12 Certificate, Basic Fire Fighting, FF1&2, Occupational Healthy Safety, Emergency Care Basic Life Support and First Aid Level, Hazmat Awareness, Operation and Emergency Care Technician amongst others.
- FF need experts in FF, DRM and any related fields.

FF Conti.....

- Most of Fire Fighters do not possess the right qualifications
- Some Fire Fighters cannot read and write, not trainable especial on theory subjects that requires reading and writing, also some fire fighters are too old to be in this field.
- LAs do not have enough, or modern equipment that can be used during emergencies,
- These hamper the daily performances of Fire Fighters and Emergency Personnel therefore need to be looked at for better solutions.

Conti.....

- Not enough Fire Fighters due to lack of funds.
- Some of the emergency equipment are old or obsolete and need to be replaced,
- There is a need for intensive Fire Fighters training and facilities for physical fitness. Daily Exercise drills, simulations are some of the programs need to be employed by LAs (fill existing gaps).

Volunteers/ Reserve Force

- Volunteers (19 DRMA) through HoC / reserve force (5 FFBSA);CFO through; (duties.....)
- Challenges

- Volunteers are not recruited as per the two laws;
- Many volunteers are either staff members of LAs, or community members who are willing to helping out when emergencies or disasters occur;
- These volunteers are not trained on emergency issues thus lack necessary skill;
