### **Concept Note**



The Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH is implementing the project 'Sustainable Urban Development – Smart Cities II' (SUDSC II) on behalf of the German Federal Ministry of Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ). The project supports the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA), Government of India, and the partner states of Assam, Karnataka, Kerala, Odisha, Tamil Nadu, and Telangana in developing resilient approaches and

solutions for sustainable urban development, by considering the principles of disaster risk management, leave no one behind (LNOB) and gender-responsive approaches. The project supports the cities of Guwahati, Mangaluru, Kochi, Bhubaneswar, Coimbatore, and Manikonda in implementing approaches for gender-responsive, inclusive, risk-informed, resilient, integrated and sustainable urban development.

#### ABOUT COMMUNITIES OF PRACTICE

As part of the SUDSC II project, one of the key components is to establish and support the setting up of Communities of Practice (CoP) in the partner cities to facilitate knowledge sharing from the local, state, national and global experiences, and to catalyse innovative practices and ideas by facilitating cross-sectoral deliberations. cooperative learning, and actions among stakeholders to promote sustainable development of cities. One of the important aspects of CoP is to ensure sustainable and inclusive urban development in making cities gender-responsive, which is directly connected with the Sustainable Development Goals (goals 5, 11, and 13) that prioritises including gender perspective

in planning inclusive cities, equitable, safe and efficient. The Government of India and states across the country have taken measures to integrate gender in their policy, programs (for instance, by adopting 'Gender Equality and Social Inclusion (GESI)' framework) in urban development.

In this background, SUDSC II project is organising a daylong workshop of CoP on climate-resilient cities and infrastructure with the topic of 'Nature-Based Solutions for building Urban Resilience with Gender Lens' in Guwahati city with the aim of bringing together a diverse range of stakeholders, including decision-makers, practitioners, urban planners, academics, private sector, and subject experts on floods, disaster risk

reduction and management, among others. The workshop intends to deliberate on various aspects of nature-based solutions (NbS) with gender-responsive approaches for inclusive and sustainable

urban development. Relevant national and international case studies and good practices will be shared and deliberated upon during the event.

#### CONTEXT

Guwahati, the capital city of the state of Assam and the gateway to the North-East India, is urbanising rapidly in recent times. However, rapid and unplanned growth of the city has led to unscientific changes in land use, posing risks of disasters, including urban floods, storms, heat waves, landslides, among others. For instance, inhabitants in the low-lying areas of the city with poor drainage system are highly vulnerable to risks from floods, water logging causing economic loss, impact health, livelihood, and loss of life.

Adoption of NbS offers a holistic approach to address the complex challenges posed by

inter-connectedness of ecological systems and human centric development, including aspects of gender. NbS is designed to restore balance, foster resilience, and promote sustainable co-existence between society and the environment. The link between NbS, urban resilience, and SDGs is integral to achieve sustainable and inclusive development of cities.

The workshop aims to discuss the concept of NbS in urban planning as a strategy for building urban resilience, and to catalyse the setting up of a city/state level CoP on NbS with a focus on gender-responsiveness.
